### **FROM THE PARSONAGE**

I'm reading a couple of biographies right now. I'm reading *Grant* by Ron Chernow and *James Madison* by Lynne Cheney. These are two men who saw the greatness and the weakness of our nation. They saw that the nation lived and died by the resolute nature of the men and women of our country. James Madison was there at the beginning of our nation, and was the President in office when England attacked and burned Washington D.C. As the story goes, there was to

be a state dinner the night of the fire and the British officers ate the meal before setting the place on fire.


General Grant witnessed some of the greatest wholesale slaughter of the Civil War. In truth, we have been an ongoing experiment of whether a democratic republic can withstand the tests of time. Can we navigate the choppy waters of the majority rule and the minority rights? Can we find a way to be a diverse community, or will we shatter on the rocks of opinion and rhetoric?

Can we find justice and truth while we find ourselves inundated with opinion and pundits? What is the truth; can we recognize it, when we see it? We are told by one group that one thing is true; while another group clearly states that not only is that not the case but to believe such a thing makes us unworthy to call ourselves American. How do we find the truth and not just statements that buttress our already held beliefs?

Well, for us in the Christian faith, we do have an answer. We ask ourselves, "How does this statement, action, event compare to Jesus' teachings? How would Jesus respond to the situation?" A few years ago, there was a book (and all the merchandizing to go along with said book) that stated Christians should always ask, "what would Jesus do? (W.W.J.D.). Although it sounds trite, that is precisely what Paul and Jesus both tell us to do – to follow Jesus' example. The term Christian was a derogatory term Romans used for us. It meant "little christs." However, we as the followers of Jesus understood that what was meant as an insult was in fact precisely what we were and are called to be and do. We are to be little christs and we are to weigh our actions and our understanding by the light of not just the Bible or the New Testament, but more precisely the Gospels – the *GOOD NEWS*. When we understand this truth, we are able to find the eternal truth of God and the golden path we have been called to follow.

#### Welcome Fall 2019

As I sit here and reflect this morning, I want to share my favorite passage as I read the daily devotion this past week. It is called "The Leaf" Pliwa Langeni. For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under the heaven. Ecclesiastes 3:1.

I'm sitting on an elevated porch tucked away in the back woods of Maine. The deck suspends safely however many feet above the ground. The plant box is supporting color for life along the edge of the deck and the picnic table upon which I sat and write are crafted from rough-hewn wood.

Beyond the deck are trees and shrubbery of more varieties and I could name. Trunks that are thick, slim, healthy, dying, split, sturdy, leaning, have branches protruding and endless directions and angles.

The wind is silent, but I can see its effects on the branches, swaying about, making the leaves dance carefreely while creating a calmly tune. There green all around me; various shades on either side of life and death.

Then there's The Leaf. It's full figured and cautious and its dance at the end of its shared branch. I wonder, in its topmost position, if it feels responsible for the well-being of all its leaves below it. Does it concern itself with sharing what bits of light reaches them under the taller trees around it?

Does it notice the brown creeping into its vitality even as it flaps about where the wind desires? Doesn't know about the looming changes ahead in these next few months, if it makes it that far into the future? Will it welcome its transformation embracing the artful and vibrant palette all around it?

Will it let go of its life-giving branch when the season beckons for its release?
